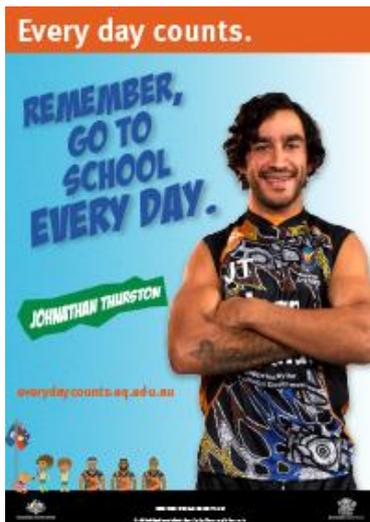

Attendance for SEMESTER 1:

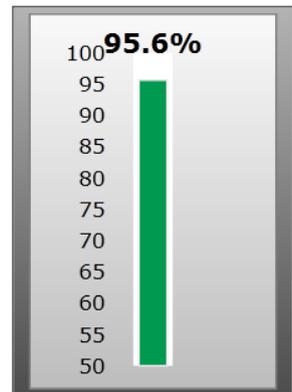
We are currently sitting at **95.6%** for the Semester.

Thought of the Week...

Why is sleep important?
